




**Mule Deer Use of Juniper Savannah Restoration Site






Results of Big-Game Aerial Surveys (2001-2013) on the Pueblo of Santa Ana
















GPS Collar Locations: Elk Bull 150 - 770









Jemez Mountains




Sandia Mountains

Proposed Improvements

- **Vegetation and Watershed Assessment**
- **Rehabilitation of mining sites**
- **Release from livestock grazing**
- **No vehicles permitted except on existing easements**
- **Closure and rehabilitation of non-essential roads**
- **Public Safety**
- **Wildlife water development**



Pueblo is opposed to:

- Urban Development
- Oil and Gas Development
- Any New Roads
- Sand/Gravel/Precious Metal Mining
- Livestock Grazing

Public Access:

- **Tract A: Preference is Closed to Public**
 - » Open to limited Public access
- **Tract B: Remain open to Public**
- **Tract C: Remain open to Public**
- **Tract D: Remain open to Public**

Horse Use:

- **No Horses**
- **Horses could be herded off of lands**
- **Horses relocated to sanctuaries**
